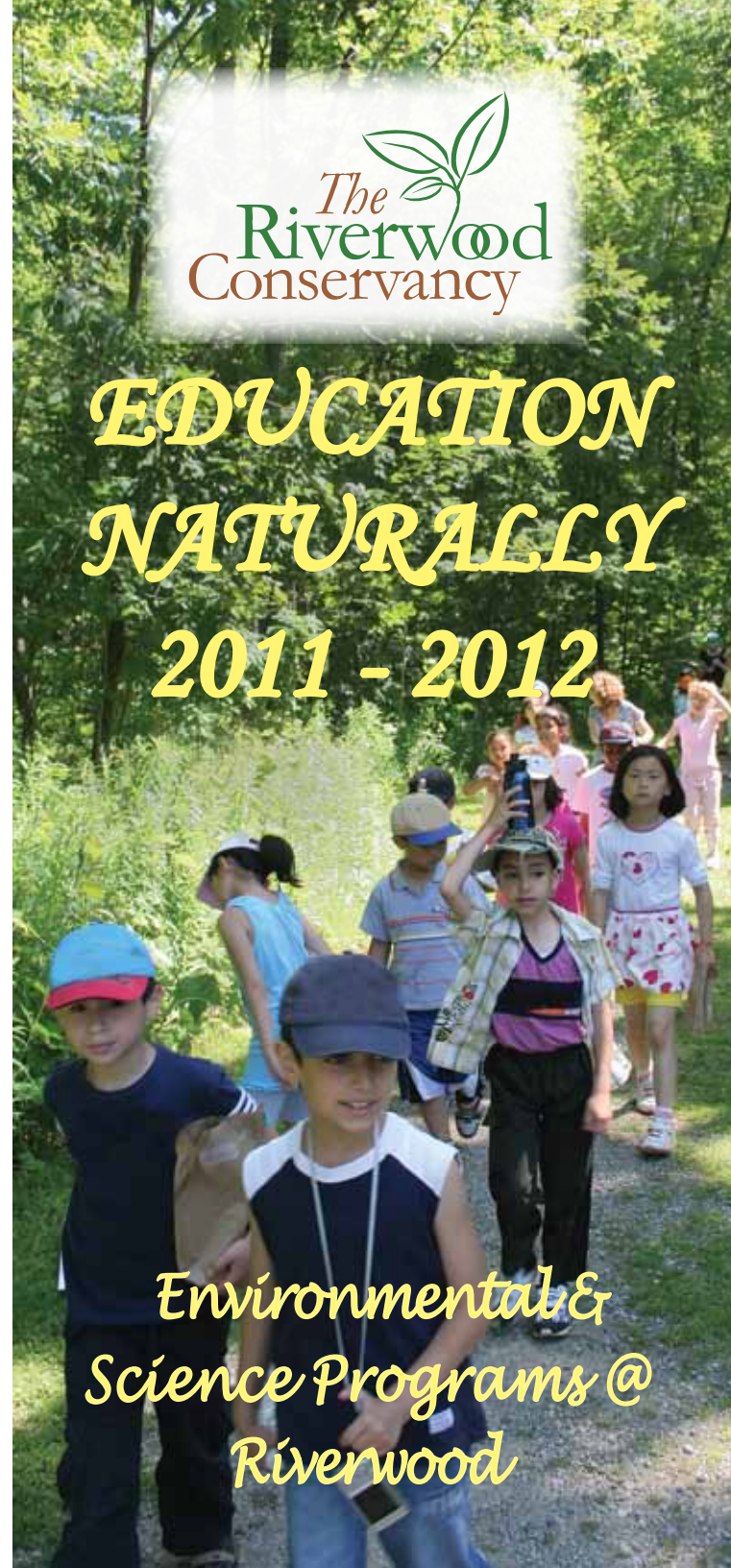

## Riverwood's MacEwan Field Station

Active, engaging experiences await your class at Riverwood all year long. Students take part in ongoing research and stewardship programs that add to their understanding of the natural world and today's science curriculum.

Students explore an urban wilderness of forests, meadows and wetlands nestled along the Credit River.

Our living laboratory is home to abundant wildlife. Programs provide students opportunities to interact with and study a variety of birds, deer, other wildlife, plants and geology.

Please note that while many of our activities take place outdoors, we do offer indoor programs in the 150-year-old MacEwan Field Station. It is heated and air-conditioned to make your experience here enjoyable even in inclement weather.

Our education programs reflect the revised Ontario Science Curriculum (2007). Our programs support the goals and expectations of the science and geography curriculums. Your visit is supported by pre- and post-visit activities that are designed to integrate with your class' science strands.

All programs include a stewardship activity that supports your curriculum goals.
